

# Knights Stream School | Mingimingi Hautoa

## ENROLMENT SCHEME

### Home Zone:

All students who live within the home zone described below and/or shown on the attached map shall be entitled to enrol at the school.

### Written Description:

Addresses on both sides of the boundary roads are included unless stated otherwise.

From the intersection of Whincops Road /Wigram Road and Halswell Junction Road,

- North west on Halswell Junction Road (including Mcteigue Road) to the Christchurch Southern Motorway,
  - Including Wigram Road to number 448 on the western side and number 409 on the eastern side of the road, including Birchgate Lane
- West along the south side only of Christchurch Southern Motorway (Stage 2) to Springs Road,
- South west along the south east side only of Springs Road to Marshs Road,
- South east along Marshs Road to Fountains Road,
- South on Fountains Road to Longstaffs Road,
- South along the eastern side only of Longstaffs Road to Whincops Road,
- North on Whincops Road to Quaifes Road,
  - Including all addresses on Downies Road
- South east along Quaifes Road to number 63 Quaifes Road,
- North to address 97 Halswell Junction Road,
- North west along the south side only of Halswell Junction Road to Whincops Road.

*Note: The description and/or the map must enable one to determine whether any particular address is in or out of zone.*

Proof of residence within the home zone may be required.

Each year, applications for enrolment in the following year from in-zone students will be sought by a date which will be published in a daily or community newspaper circulating in the area served by the school. This will enable the board to assess the number of places which can be made available to students who live outside the home zone.

### Out of zone enrolments

Each year the board will determine the number of places which are likely to be available in the following year for the enrolment of students who live outside the

home zone. The board will publish this information by notice in a daily or community newspaper circulating in the area served by the school. The notice will indicate how applications are to be made and will specify a date by which all applications must be received.

Applications for enrolment will be processed in the following order of priority:

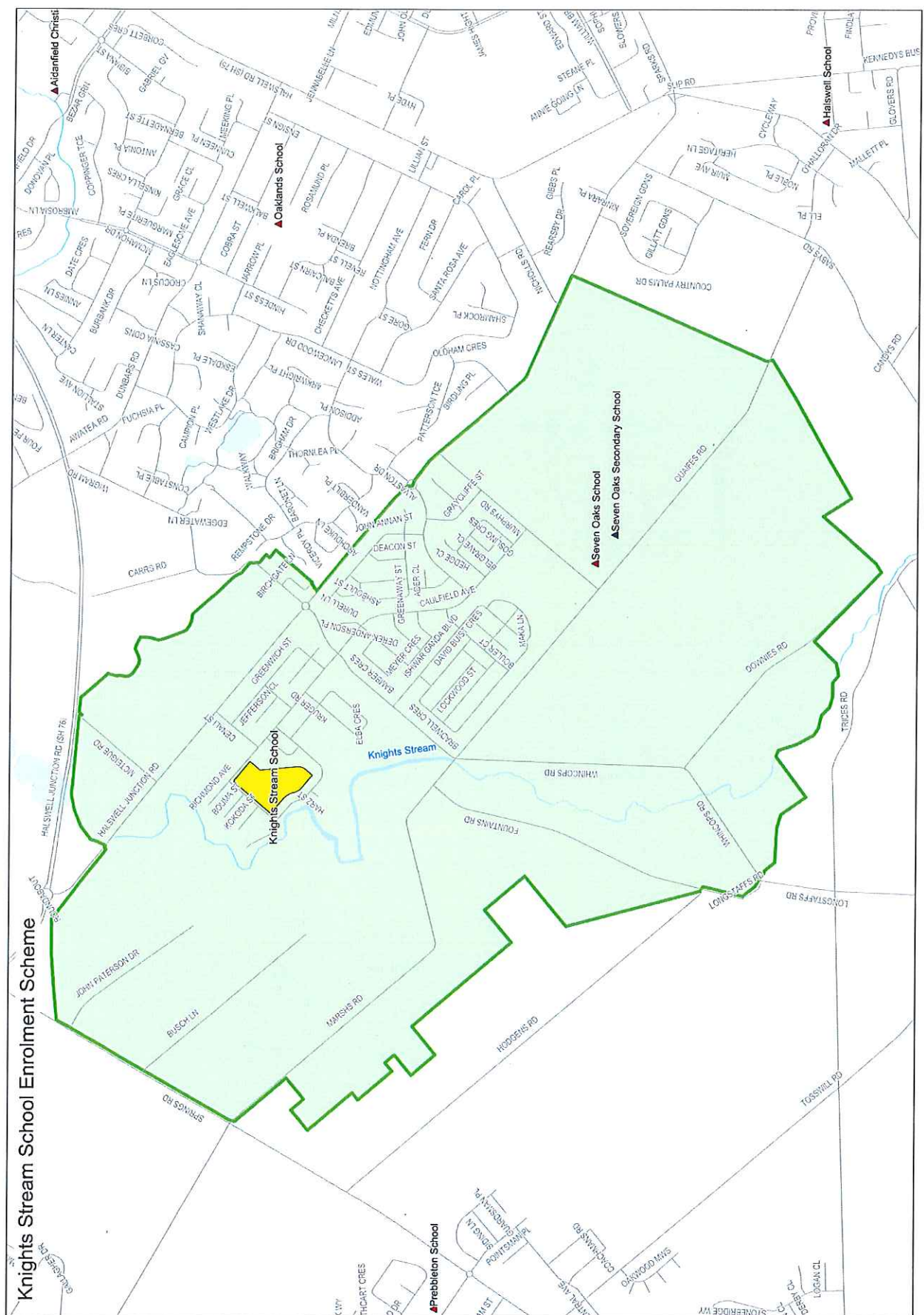
The order of priority in which applicants who live outside a school's home zone are to be offered places at the school is as follows:

- (a) first priority must be given to any applicant who is accepted for enrolment in a special programme run by the school: This priority category is not applicable at this school because the school does not run a special programme approved by the Secretary.
- (b) second priority must be given to any applicant who is the sibling of a current student of the school:
- (c) third priority must be given to any student who is the sibling of a former student of the school:
- (d) fourth priority must be given to any applicant who is a child of a former student of the school:
- (e) fifth priority must be given to any applicant who is either a child of an employee of the board of the school or a child of a member of the board of the school:
- (f) sixth priority must be given to all other applicants.

If there are more applicants in the second, third, fourth, fifth or sixth priority groups than there are places available, selection within the priority group will be by a ballot conducted in accordance with instructions issued by the Secretary under Section 11G(1) of the Education Act 1989. Parents will be informed of the date of any ballot by notice in a daily or community newspaper circulating in the area served by the school.

Applicants seeking second or third priority status may be required to give proof of a sibling relationship.
